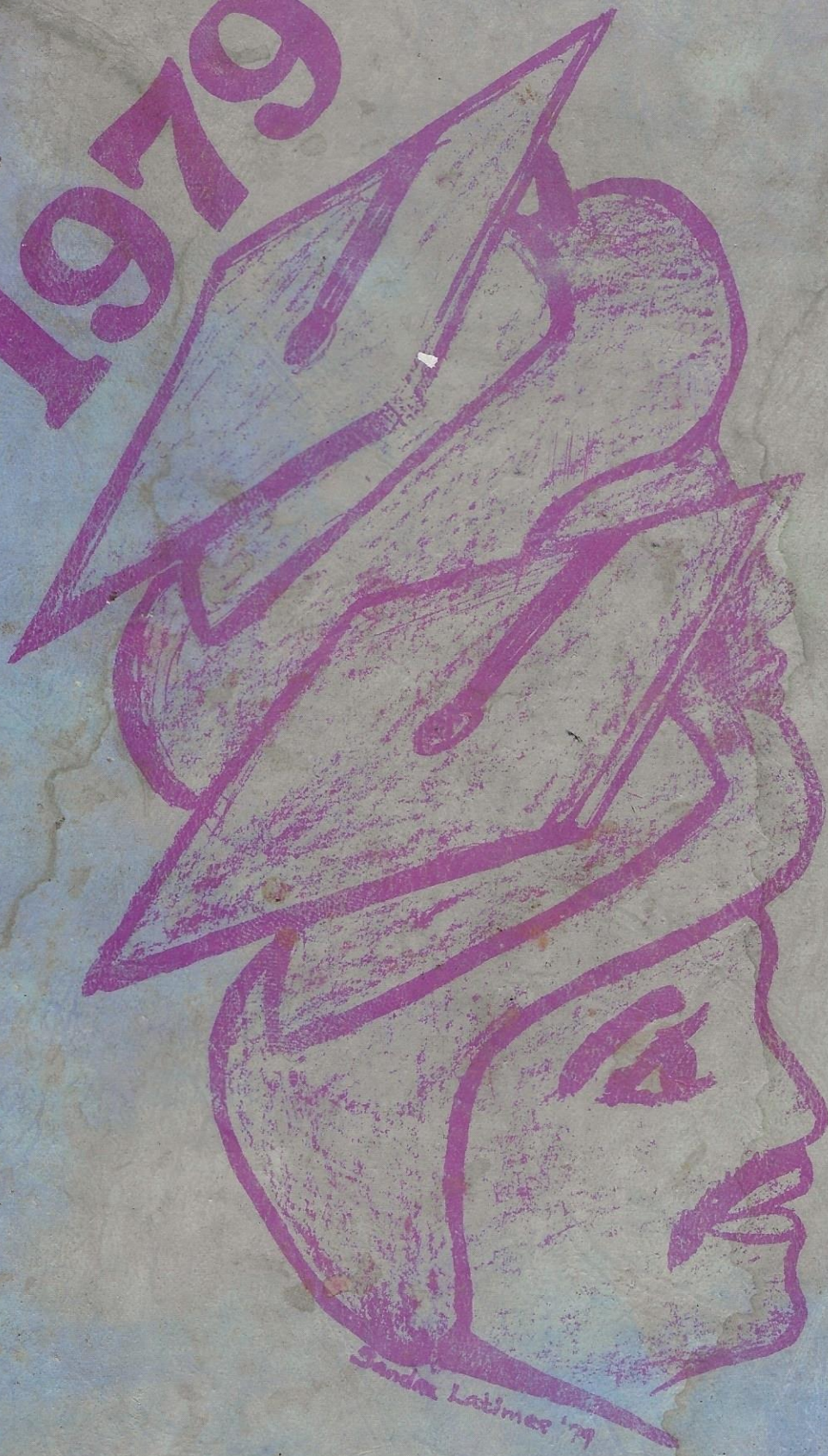

Years can't erase the pleasure

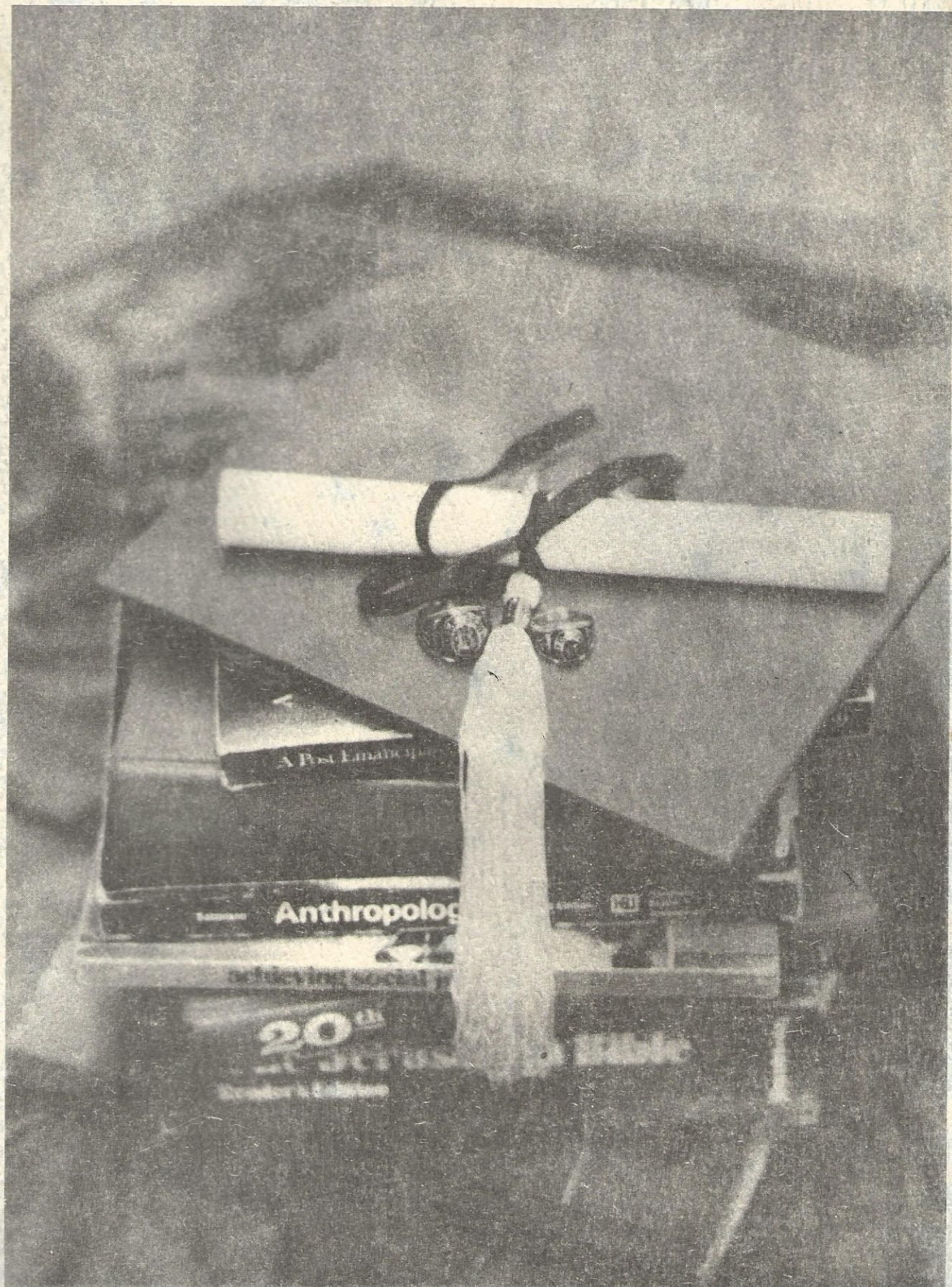
That the joy of friendship gives
